

SENATE BILL No. 24

DIGEST OF SB 24 (Updated January 17, 2018 1:53 pm - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 20-34; IC 34-30.

Synopsis: Student possession and use of sunscreen. Provides that a student may possess and use a topical, non-aerosol sunscreen product while on school property or at a school sponsored event or activity without being required to: (1) have a physician's note or prescription; without being required to: (1) have a physician's note or prescription; or (2) store the topical, non-aerosol sunscreen product in a specific location; if the product is regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration for over-the-counter use for the purpose of limiting ultraviolet light-induced skin damage. Allows school personnel to assist a student in applying the sunscreen if the school has written permission from the student's parent or guardian. Provides certain civil immunity for school corporations, schools, and school personnel for any action taken to comply with the sunscreen provisions any action taken to comply with the sunscreen provisions.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

SENATE BILL No. 24

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-34-3-22 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2018]: Sec. 22. (a) As used in this section, "school" means a
4	public or charter school.
5	(b) A student may possess and use a topical, non-aerosol
6	sunscreen product while on school property or at a school
7	sponsored event or activity without being required to:
8	(1) have a physician's note or prescription; or
9	(2) store the topical, non-aerosol sunscreen product in a
10	specific location;
11	if the product is regulated by the United States Food and Drug
12	Administration for over-the-counter use for the purpose of limiting
13	ultraviolet light-induced skin damage.
14	(c) School personnel may assist a student in applying a topical,
15	non-aerosol sunscreen product if the school has written permission
16	from the student's parent or guardian.

(d) A school corporation, a school, and school personnel are

1	immune from civil liability for any actions taken in good faith to
2	comply with this section. The civil immunity under this subsection
3	does not apply to an act or omission that constitutes gross
4	negligence or willful, wanton, or intentional misconduct.
5	(e) This section may not be construed to:
6	(1) require school personnel to assist students in applying a
7	topical sunscreen product; or
8	(2) prohibit a school from allowing a topical, aerosol
9	sunscreen product under school policy.
10	(f) The department may provide assistance and guidance to
11	schools concerning the administration of this section.
12	SECTION 2. IC 34-30-2-85.4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
13	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
14	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 85.4. IC 20-34-3-22 (Concerning
15	school corporations, schools, and school personnel and sunscreen).
