Synopsis: School curriculum. Requires each school corporation, charter school, and accredited nonpublic elementary school to include cursive writing in its curriculum.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2	As part of the United States government credit awarded for the
3	general, Core 40, Core 40 with academic honors, and Core 40
4	with technical honors designation, each high school shall
5	administer the naturalization examination provided by the United
6	States Citizenship and Immigration Services.
7	(4) Sciences, including, after June 30, 2021, computer science.
8	(5) Fine arts, including music and art.
9	(6) Health education, physical fitness, safety, and the effects of
10	alcohol, tobacco, drugs, and other substances on the human body.
11	(7) Additional studies selected by each governing body, subject
12	to revision by the state board.
13	(b) Each:

27	accredited nonpublic elementary school's curriculum language arts

29	SECTION 3. IC 20-30-6.1-2 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY
30	1, 2020]. Sec. 2. Each school corporation may include cursive writing
31	in the school corporation's curriculum.
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
