DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-13-2; IC 9-24; IC 16-18-2-328.7; IC 16-37-2-1.5.

Synopsis: Gender on driver's licenses. Defines "gender" for purposes of the motor vehicle law. Defines "nonbinary designation" for purposes of the motor vehicle law. Defines "sex" for purposes of certificates of birth. Sets forth requirements to change the gender that appears on: (1) a driver's license; (2) a driver's permit; (3) an identification card; or (4) a photo exempt identification card. Prohibits: (1) a driver's license; (2) a driver's permit; (3) an identification card; or (4) a photo exempt identification card; from displaying a nonbinary designation. Specifies that certain credentials with a nonbinary designation are valid until their date of expiration. Requires a person to specify a gender when renewing a credential that previously displayed a nonbinary designation. Specifies that the presence of a nonbinary designation on a credential used to obtain: (1) a driver's license; (2) a driver's permit; (3) an identification card; or (4) a photo exempt identification card; does not abrogate certain prohibitions concerning the display of nonbinary designations.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

- (1) a certified amended certificate of birth; or
- (2) a physician's signed and dated statement that the applicant successfully underwent all treatment necessary to permanently change the applicant's gender.
- (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a nonbinary designation shall not be permitted or displayed on a bureau issued identification card. The presence of a nonbinary designation on a document or credential used to obtain an identification card does not abrogate the prohibition against nonbinary designations described under this section.
 - (c) A valid, bureau issued identification card that:
 - (1) was issued before July 1, 2020; and
 - (2) displays a nonbinary designation;
- shall remain valid until its date of expiration. A person who possesses an identification card described under this subsection must specify a gender when renewing an identification card described under this subsection.
