DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-21-8-60.

Synopsis: Operating a vehicle. Requires a person to operate a vehicle: (1) in a careful and prudent manner; (2) using due regard for the given weather conditions, road conditions, and traffic conditions; and (3) in such a way as to maintain proper control of the vehicle. Provides that a person who operates a vehicle in a reckless and careless manner commits a Class C infraction.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

8	(C) traffic conditions; and
9	(3) in such a way as to maintain proper control of the vehicle.
10	(b) A person who violates this section commits a Class C
11	infraction.
