## **SENATE BILL No. 231**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 2-5-46.

**Synopsis:** Competitive teacher pay initiative review. Requires the legislative services agency to do the following: (1) Collect, review, and evaluate information concerning teacher pay matters. (2) Not later than December 31, 2020, submit a report regarding the information to the general assembly.

Effective: Upon passage.

## SENATE BILL No. 231

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 2-5-46 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON
PASSAGE]:
Chapter 46. Competitive Teacher Pay Initiative Review
Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "classroom teacher" means a
teacher whose primary employment responsibility is to provide
instruction to students in a public school.
Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "public school" means a:
(1) school maintained by a school corporation; and
(2) charter school.
Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "teacher salary and benefits"
means the salary and benefits that a classroom teacher receives
through the teacher's employment in a public school in Indiana or
similar entity in another state and includes only annual salary,
health care benefits, and pension benefits.
Sec. 4. (a) The legislative services agency shall do the following:
(1) Collect, review, and evaluate information regarding the

2	(A) For each year beginning with 2015 through 2019 and
3	to the extent the information is available, a comparison of
4	teacher salary and benefits in Indiana to teacher salary
5	and benefits nationally, regionally, and in the states
6	surrounding Indiana.
7	(B) An estimate of the amount of funding needed to
8	increase, if applicable, the teacher salary and benefits in
9	Indiana so that teacher salary and benefits in Indiana are
10	equivalent to the:
11	(i) national teacher salary and benefits;
12	(ii) regional teacher salary and benefits; and
13	(iii) teacher salary and benefits in the states surrounding
14	Indiana.
15	(C) The potential financial impact on the state of Indiana
16	in funding the amount described in clause (B).
17	(D) Information regarding any demographic factors that
18	may cause a decline in the number of individuals who
19	pursue a teaching career in Indiana.
20	(E) Possible options and the logistics regarding directing
21	any state money directly to a teacher and not to a state
22	agency, school corporation, school, or any other entity.
23	(F) Cost of living calculations for Indiana, in the states
24	surrounding Indiana, and other areas of the United States.
25	(2) Prepare a report regarding the information described in
26	subdivision (1).
27	(b) The legislative services agency may contract with a state
28	educational institution to provide the information described in
29	subsection (a)(1)(D).
30	(c) The legislative services agency shall, not later than December
31	31,2020, submit the report prepared under subsection (a)(2) to the
32	general assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
33	(d) This chapter expires July 1, 2021.
34	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
