DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-30-5-7.

Synopsis: Civics test passage rate report. Beginning in 2022, requires that the department of education (department) annually report to the general assembly the number of students who pass the naturalization exam by at least 60% on their first attempt. Requires that the department post the passage rate on its Internet web site.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

29	to the general assembly the passage rate calculated for subsection
30	(d), the department shall post the passage rate on the department's
31	Internet web site.
