DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-28-5-25.

Synopsis: Education matters. Makes changes to the professional growth experience points requirements for a person renewing a practitioner license or accomplished practitioner license. Establishes a committee to study school accountability, school assessments, and teacher salary, professional development, and evaluations and make recommendations.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 332

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-28-5-25, AS ADDED BY P.L.143-2019.
2	SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 25. (a) This section applies to a professional
4	growth plan that:
5	(1) begins after July 1, 2019; and
6	(2) is completed for the purpose of renewing a:
7	(A) practitioner license; or
8	(B) accomplished practitioner license.
9	(b) Fifteen (15) Subject to subsection (d), if a person provides
0	instruction in grade 9, 10, 11, or 12 at any time during the term of
1	a license described in subsection (a)(2), ten (10) of the total number
2	of professional growth experience points required to renew a
3	practitioner license or an accomplished practitioner the license must be
4	obtained through the completion of one (1) or more of the following:
5	(1) An externship with a company.
6	(2) Professional development provided by the state, a local
7	business, or a community partner that provides opportunities for



1	schools and employers to partner in promoting career navigation
2	(3) Professional development provided by the state, a local
3	business, or a community partner that outlines the:
4	(A) current and future economic needs of the community
5	state, nation, and globe; and
6	(B) ways in which the current and future economic needs
7	described in clause (A) can be disseminated to students.
8	(c) Subject to subsection (d), if a person provides instruction in
9	grade 6, 7, or 8 at any time during the term of a license described
10	in subsection (a)(2), five (5) of the total number of professional
11	growth experience points required to renew the license must be
12	obtained through the completion of one (1) or more of the
13	externships or professional development listed in subsection (b)(1)
14	through (b)(3).
15	(d) If a person provides instruction in a grade listed in
16	subsection (b) and a grade listed in subsection (c) during the term
17	of a license described in subsection (a)(2), the person is required to
18	obtain a total of ten (10) professional growth experience points as
19	required under subsection (b).
20	(e) If a person provides instruction in kindergarten through
21	grade 5 during the term of a license described in subsection (a)(2)
22	the person may obtain professional growth experience points
23	required to renew the license through the completion of one (1) or
24	more of the following:
25	(1) The externships or professional development listed in
26	subsection (b)(1) through (b)(3).
27	(2) Any other activities as determined by the state board.
28	However, if the person described under this subsection provides
29	instruction as described in subsection (b), (c), or (d) at any time
30	during the term of the license, the person is subject to subsection
31	(b), (c), or (d), as applicable.
32	SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) The definitions
33	used in IC 20 apply throughout this SECTION.
34	(b) As used in this SECTION, "statewide assessment" refers to
35	the statewide assessment required under IC 20-32-5.1-7.
36	(c) A committee is established to study school accountability
37	school assessments, and teacher salary, professional development
38	and evaluations and to make recommendations of its findings. The
39	committee shall study and consider the following when making its
40	recommendations:
41	(1) The impact of eliminating funding for all benchmark

formative, interim, or similar assessments other than the

1	statewide assessment.
2	(2) The effect that the results from the statewide assessment
3	and other similar assessments have on school accountability
4	teacher evaluations, and teacher salaries under current state
5	and federal law.
6	(3) Ways in which the statewide assessment and other similar
7	assessments could be used to positively affect teaching
8	methods and student development.
9	(4) The content and delivery of the results of the statewide
10	assessment to schools and parents.
11	(5) Engaging teachers or establishing a committee of teachers
12	to review and report to the general assembly regarding the
13	effectiveness of the statewide assessment.
14	(6) Increasing teacher engagement in the development of the
15	statewide assessment.
16	(7) Limiting how much the outcome of student assessments
17	affects teacher evaluations and salary.
18	(8) Requiring the department or state board to develop
19	specific and targeted professional development for
20	administrative staff and teachers in low performing schools.
21	(9) Methods that could be employed to continue monitoring
22	best practices and reward growth metrics in all schools.
23	(10) Considerations in raising teacher salaries in Indiana
24	including considering:
25	(A) how teacher salaries in Indiana compare to teacher
26	salaries nationally and in the states surrounding Indiana;
27	(B) the fiscal impact of funding an increase in teacher
28	salaries in Indiana; and
29	(C) teacher pensions and the importance of continuing to
30	fully fund teacher pensions.
31	(11) Funding externships and other professional development
32	described in IC 20-28-5-25(b) for teachers.
33	(d) The committee may collect and consider any other studies
34	research, or reports by other public or private agencies or entities
35	on the topics listed in subsection (c).
36	(e) Not later than December 1, 2020, the committee shall submit
37	its recommendations in a final report to the:
38	(1) governor; and
39	(2) general assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
40	(f) The committee consists of the following twenty-three (23)
41	members:

(1) The superintendent of public instruction.

1	(2) The commissioner of the department of workforce
2	development.
3	(3) The commissioner of the commission for higher education.
4	(4) The chairperson of the senate education and career
5	development committee.
6	(5) The chairperson of the house of representatives education
7	committee.
8	(6) A member of the state board elected by the state board
9	with a majority vote not later than May 1, 2020.
10	(7) The governor shall appoint the following five (5) members:
11	(A) One (1) member who serves as chairperson of the
12	panel. The member appointed as chairperson of the panel
13	must be a current or former educator or school
14	administrator.
15	(B) One (1) member who is a teacher.
16	(C) One (1) member who is a principal.
17	(D) One (1) member who is a school superintendent.
18	(E) One (1) member who is a faculty member or researcher
19	at the college or university level and who has expertise in
20	issues related to elementary and secondary education.
21	(8) The president pro tempore of the senate shall appoint the
22	following four (4) members:
23	(A) One (1) member who is a teacher.
24	(B) One (1) member who is a principal.
25	(C) One (1) member who is a school superintendent.
26	(D) One (1) member who is a business leader.
27	(9) The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint
28	the following four (4) members:
29	(A) One (1) member who is a teacher.
30	(B) One (1) member who is a principal.
31	(C) One (1) member who is a school superintendent.
32	(D) One (1) member who is a parent of a student in an
33	elementary or secondary school.
34	(10) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint the
35	following four (4) members:
36	(A) One (1) member who is a teacher.
37	(B) One (1) member who is a principal.
38	(C) One (1) member who is a school superintendent.
39	(D) One (1) member representing a school employee
40	organization (as defined in IC 20-29-2-14).
41	(g) Members appointed under subsection (f) shall be appointed
42	by the member's respective appointing authority not later than



May 1, 2020. Each member appointed under subsection (f) serves
at the will of the member's appointing authority.
(h) A quorum of the committee consists of twelve (12) members.
The affirmative vote of at least twelve (12) members of the
committee is necessary for any action to be taken by the committee.
(i) The committee shall meet at the call of the chairperson.
(j) The legislative services agency shall provide administrative
support for the committee. Upon request, the state board and the
department shall provide research, data, and technical assistance
for the committee in a timely manner.
(k) Each member of the committee who is not a state employee
is entitled to receive both of the following:
(1) The minimum salary per diem provided by
IC 4-10-11-2.1(b).
(2) Reimbursement for travel expenses, as provided in the
state travel policies and procedures established by the Indiana
department of administration and approved by the budget
agency.
(l) Each member of the committee who is a state employee is
entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses actually incurred in
connection with the member's duties, as provided in the state travel
policies and procedures established by the Indiana department of
administration and approved by the budget agency.
(m) Meetings of the committee must comply with IC 5-14-1.5.
(n) This SECTION expires January 1, 2021.
SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.
