## **SENATE BILL No. 428**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 31-9-2-2; IC 31-25-2-24.

**Synopsis:** Report on child fatalities. Expands the department of child services annual report concerning child fatalities in Indiana to include all child fatalities in Indiana: (1) that involved adoptees; and (2) that involved children who solely received home based instruction.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

5	received home based instruction.
6	(3) (5) An analysis of the primary risk factors involved in child
7	fatalities resulting from abuse or neglect.
8	(4) (6) A summary of the most frequent causes of child fatalities
9	resulting from abuse or neglect.
10	(5) (7) A description of the manner in which the information was
11	assembled.
12	The department shall post the report prepared under this section on the
13	department's Internet web site.
14	(b) As part of the summary of information described in subsection
15	(a)(1), the report must include whether the death occurred in either of
16	the following settings:
17	(1) While the child was placed in foster care.
18	(2) After the child, who was once placed in foster care, was
19	returned to a natural parent.
