DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-26-5-38; IC 31-33-26-19.

Synopsis: Child abuse education and reporting. Requires a school to adopt a policy concerning child abuse education and training. Requires the department of child services to create an annual report of the total number of substantiated reports of child abuse and neglect received over the previous year, with numbers broken down into certain categories.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

SENATE BILL No. 436

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-26-5-38 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2017]: Sec. 38. (a) A school corporation, including a charter
4	school and an accredited nonpublic school, shall adopt and
5	implement a policy concerning child abuse, including child sexual
6	abuse. A policy adopted under this section must include the
7	following:
8	(1) An age appropriate program that provides educational
9	information for elementary school students and high school
10	students, including:
11	(A) counseling and referral resources available to students;
12	and
13	(B) educational support information for a child who is a
14	victim of abuse or sexual abuse.
15	(2) Training for school employees:
16	(A) to increase awareness of required reporting duties and
17	procedures; and



1	(B) to increase knowledge of likely warning signs
2	indicating that a child may be a victim of child abuse or
3	child sexual abuse.
4	(3) Educational information in the school handbook on the
5	warning signs indicating that a child may be a victim of child
6	abuse or child sexual abuse, and obtaining assistance and
7	intervention.
8	(b) A policy described in subsection (a) must incorporate
9	materials identified and developed by the department under
10	IC 20-19-3-11.
11	SECTION 2. IC 31-33-26-19 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
12	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
13	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 19. By August 1 of each year, the
14	department shall post a report on the department's Internet web
15	site that contains information concerning the number of
16	substantiated reports of child abuse and neglect received over the
17	previous year. The report may not include any information
18	allowing any individual or victim to be identified. The report mus
19	include the number of substantiated reports broken down into the
20	following categories:
21	(1) Total number of substantiated reports.
22	(2) Number of substantiated reports by type (abuse or
23	neglect).
24	(3) Number of substantiated reports by age of a child victim
25	(4) Number of substantiated reports by gender of a child
26	victim.
