# **SENATE BILL No. 445**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-28-3-10; IC 20-28-5.

**Synopsis:** Micro-credentialing. Requires the state board of education (state board) to establish a micro-credential program to supplement current teacher renewal requirements or that allows a micro-credential to be obtained as part of a professional growth plan. Requires the state board to approve one or more micro-credential programs to meet the state board's requirements. Provides that the state board shall prioritize certain criteria in establishing a micro-credential program. Requires the commission for higher education (commission) to study whether a micro-credential program can be used toward a master's degree. Requires the commission to submit a report to the state board about its findings.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-28-3-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2020]: Sec. 10. (a) The state board shall establish a
4	micro-credential program:
5	(1) to supplement current teacher license renewal
6	requirements; or
7	(2) that allows a micro-credential to be obtained as part of a
8	professional growth plan.
9	(b) The state board shall establish requirements necessary for
10	a teacher to obtain a micro-credential.
11	(c) Before July 1, 2021, the state board shall approve one (1) or
12	more micro-credential programs to meet the requirements to
13	obtain micro-credentialing established by the state board under
14	subsection (b).
15	(d) The state board shall prioritize and consider when
16	establishing a micro-credential program under subsection (a) or
17	approving a micro-credential program under subsection (c)



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1	whether the micro-credential program:
2	(1) is meaningful or contributes to license renewal;
3	(2) allows teachers to qualify for salary increases or bonuses;
4	(3) allows teachers the opportunity for career advancement
5	and leadership positions;
6	(4) allows teachers to demonstrate, through
7	micro-credentialing, the mastery of skills required for license
8	renewal and supplemental payments;
9	(5) addresses specific classroom instruction needs;
10	(6) may allow teachers the ability to satisfy requirements for

17	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 3. (a) The department shall designate the grade
18	point average required for each type of license.
19	(b) The department shall determine details of licensing not provided
20	in this chapter, including requirements regarding the following:
21	(1) The conversion of one (1) type of license into another.
22	(2) The accreditation of teacher education schools and
23	departments.
24	(3) The exchange and renewal of licenses.
25	(4) The endorsement of another state's license.
26	(5) The acceptance of credentials from teacher education
27	institutions of another state.
28	(6) The academic and professional preparation for each type of
29	license.
30	(7) The granting of permission to teach a high school subject area
31	related to the subject area for which the teacher holds a license.
32	(8) The issuance of licenses on credentials.
33	(9) The type of license required for each school position.
34	(10) The size requirements for an elementary school requiring a
35	licensed principal.
36	(11) The completion of micro-credentialing by teachers for
37	license renewal.

39	The department shall establish at least one (1) system for renewing a
40	teaching license that does not require a graduate degree.
41	(c) This subsection does not apply to an applicant for a substitute
42	teacher license or to an individual granted a license under section 18

2	initial practitioner license at any grade level to an applicant for an
3	initial practitioner license unless the applicant shows evidence that the

16	SECTION 3. IC 20-28-5-25, AS ADDED BY P.L.143-2019,
17	SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
18	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 25. (a) This section applies to a professional
19	growth plan that begins after July 1, 2019.
20	(b) Fifteen (15) of the total number of professional growth
$\frac{1}{21}$	experience points required to renew a practitioner license or an
22	accomplished practitioner license must be obtained through the
$\frac{22}{23}$	completion of one (1) or more of the following:
24	(1) An externship with a company.
25	(2) Professional development provided by the state, a local
26	business, or a community partner that provides opportunities for
27	schools and employers to partner in promoting career navigation.
28	(3) Professional development provided by the state, a local
29	business, or a community partner that outlines the:
30	(A) current and future economic needs of the community,
31	state, nation, and globe; and

34	(4) A micro-credential program established or approved by
35	the state board under IC 20-28-3-10.
36	SECTION 4. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020] (a) The definitions in
37	IC 21-18-1 apply throughout this SECTION.
38	(b) The commission shall study the possible application of
39	higher education program credits to individual master's degree
40	programs for the following:
41	(1) Micro-credential attainment.
42	(2) Classroom or other experience.
