SENATE RESOLUTION No. 4

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION concerning the motor vehicle
2	inspection and maintenance programs in Lake and Porter
3	counties.
4	Whereas, The motor vehicle inspection and maintenance
5	(I/M) programs in Lake and Porter counties were mandated by
6	the federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990, based on Lake
7	and Porter counties' designation as "nonattainment", along
8	with northeast Illinois and southeast Wisconsin, under the
9	one-hour ozone standard;
10	Whereas, According to the United States Environmental
11	Protection Agency (EPA), cars and trucks collectively are the
12	single greatest contributor to ground-level ozone, the major
13	component of smog;
14	Whereas, The purpose of an I/M program is to reduce
15	ground-level ozone by ensuring that the emission control
16	systems on vehicles are working correctly;
17	Whereas, Generally, only vehicles registered in Lake and
18	Porter counties are subject to the I/M programs in Lake and
19	Porter counties;
20	Whereas, Lake and Porter counties in northwest Indiana are
21	intersected by Interstate Highway 80/90 and Interstate
22	Highway 94, two of the most heavily traveled highways in the



1	Midwest, and Lake County is also intersected by Interstate
2	Highway 65, another heavily traveled highway, linking major
3	southern cities with Indianapolis and Chicago;
4	Whereas, The citizens of Lake and Porter counties have been
5	burdened with the cost of the testing and remediation required
6	under the I/M program, even though thousands of out-of-state
7	vehicles pass through these areas on a daily basis without the
8	burden of submitting to the I/M program;
9	Whereas, Lake and Porter counties are linked to the Chicago
10	Nonattainment Area based on violations in northeast Illinois
11	and southeast Wisconsin;
12	Whereas, Under the standards promulgated in 2015 for
13	ozone, nine monitors within the Chicago Nonattainment Area
14	exceed the standard, but none of the monitors are located in
15	Indiana; and
16	Whereas, Lake and Porter counties have the most stringent
17	suite of control measures in the Midwest, and have consistently
18	met EPA's objectives; Therefore,
19	Be it resolved by the Senate
20	of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
21	SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly urges the
22	Honorable Donald J. Trump, President of the United States, the
23	Honorable Michael R. Pence, Vice President of the United
24	States, and members of the United States Congress from
25	Indiana to instruct the Environmental Protection Agency to
26	remove Lake and Porter counties from the Chicago
27	Nonattainment Area, and thereby eliminate the requirements
28	under which the motor vehicle inspection and maintenance
29	programs in Lake and Porter counties are operated.
30	SECTION 2. That copies of this resolution be transmitted by
31	the Secretary of the Senate to the Honorable Donald J. Trump,
32	President of the United States; the Honorable Michael R. Pence,
33	Vice President of the United States; the Honorable Joe
