SENATE RESOLUTION No. 13

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A SENATE RESOLUTION recognizing the 40th anniversary of the Indiana-Taiwan sister-state relationship and the United States Congress's enacting of the Taiwan Relations Act, supporting Taiwan's signing of a Bilateral Trade Agreement with the United States, and reaffirming support for increasing Taiwan's international profile.

Whereas, The State of Indiana is proud of the sister-state
relationship it has enjoyed with the Republic of China (Taiwan)
since 1979, which is marked by strong bilateral trade,
educational and cultural exchanges, and tourism;

Whereas, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom,
democracy, human rights, the rule of law, peace, and prosperity
with the United States and the State of Indiana;

Whereas, The United States Congress passed the Taiwan
Relations Act (TRA) in 1979 to sustain a close bilateral
relationship between the United States and Taiwan, as well as
to advance their mutual security and commercial interests;

Whereas, The TRA has served as the cornerstone of U.S.Taiwan relations and has helped to preserve peace and stability



in the Taiwan Strait;

Whereas, The United States ranks as Taiwan's second
largest trading partner, Taiwan is the eleventh largest trading
partner of the United States, and bilateral trade reached \$68.2
billion in 2017;

6 Whereas, Taiwan and the State of Indiana have enjoyed a 7 long and mutually beneficial relationship with the prospect of 8 future growth, and Taiwan was Indiana's seventh largest export 9 market in Asia in 2017, with \$195 million worth of Indiana 10 goods exported to Taiwan;

11 Whereas, Negotiations for a Bilateral Trade Agreement 12 (BTA) between Taiwan and the United States are an important 13 step toward further strengthening bilateral trade between our 14 countries, thereby increasing Indiana's exports to Taiwan and 15 creating bilateral investment and technical collaboration 16 through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures; 17 and

18 Whereas, Taiwan has undertaken a policy of "steadfast 19 diplomacy" in its international relations, is capable of and 20 willing to fulfill its responsibilities, and is willing to collaborate 21 with the world to deal with the challenges of humanitarian aid, 22 disease control, and so forth: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate recognizes the 40th 25 anniversary of the Indiana-Taiwan sister-state relationship and the 26 United States Congress's enacting of the Taiwan Relations Act, 27 supports Taiwan's signing of a Bilateral Trade Agreement with the 28 United States, offers its continued support to Taiwan's meaningful 29 30 participation in international organizations which impact the health, safety, and well-being of its people, and supports its aspiration to make 31 more contributions in international societies. 32
