SENATE RESOLUTION No. 33

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council
2	to assign to the appropriate committee the topic of improving
3	the professionalism of county veteran service officers so as to
4	ensure veterans are fully served in every county in Indiana.
5	Whereas, Current Indiana Code requires every county to
6	have an accredited veteran service officer;
7	Whereas, The Federal Department of Veterans Affairs
8	requires annual re-accreditation to be able to represent
9	veterans in filing their disability claims and to seek other
10	federal veteran earned benefits;
11	Whereas, The state of Indiana has not funded county
12	veteran service officer training;
13	Whereas, Indiana requires annual training for re-
14	certification to maintain expertise as the disability claims
15	process changes often through the United State Department of
16	Veterans Affairs;
17	Whereas, County veterans service officers and city veterans
18	service officers can be appointed for four year terms;



1	Whereas, The duties of a county veterans service officer can
2	vary from county to county;
3	Whereas, In some instances county veterans service officers
4	are not trained or accredited in a timely manner and there are
5	no consequences, even though the failure to become accredited
6	is contrary to federal regulations and Indiana law;
7	Whereas, some county service officers do not become
8	accredited, do not retain their accreditation, or retire and must
9	be replaced;
10	Whereas, Initial training and replacement training are
l 1	crucial to the success and support of veterans who need
12	assistance;
13	Whereas, Current, initial county veterans service officer
14	training does not insure that candidates are capable of
15	developing a disability claim on behalf of the veteran they are
16	serving, which is contrary to federal requirements;
17	Whereas, This results in county veterans service officers
18	having their work reviewed, corrected, and submitted by other
19	veteran service officers who were trained to national
20	standards;
21	Whereas, The best training provided to county veterans
22	service officers is administered by the National Association of
23	County Veteran Services Officers (NACVSO); and
24	Whereas, Some counties are not in compliance with Indiana
25	Code and have not replaced, in a timely manner, county
26	veterans service officers, thereby not sufficiently providing
27	services to veterans in their counties: Therefore,
28	Be it resolved by the Senate of the
29	General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign the following topics to the appropriate study committee: 1. Funding training for new county veterans service officers and re-accreditation training for existing officers. 2. Extending the employment of county veterans service officers to at least five years. 3. Notifying a county that they are in violation of Indiana Code when they do not have a trained and accredited county veterans service officer. 4. Ensuring that Indiana accreditation standards are the same as the National standards.
