## SENATE RESOLUTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

1       A SENATE RESOLUTION memorializing Norma  
2 Schlossberg.

3       *Whereas, Norma Schlossberg was born in Portland, Maine*  
4 *and met Marshall Schlossberg of Anderson, Indiana during*  
5 *World War II, after which, she moved to Anderson and the*  
6 *couple was married;*

7       *Whereas, Norma had two daughters, Paula and Ellen,*  
8 *whom she cared for as a homemaker, while also becoming one*  
9 *of the most prominent community activists in Madison County*  
10 *and Anderson;*

11       *Whereas, Norma served on many boards within the*  
12 *Anderson community, including: Girl Scouts of America, the*  
13 *United Way of Madison County, Madison County Legal*  
14 *Services, East Central Legal Services of Indiana, the Madison*  
15 *Community Health Center, the March of Dimes, Anderson*  
16 *Urban League, the Panel of American Women championing*  
17 *diversity, CASA of Madison County, NAACP of Madison*  
18 *County, United Faith Housing, Madison County League of*  
19 *Women Voters, the YWCA, a citizen member of the Anderson*  
20 *Herald Bulletin editorial board, and the Mayor's Commission*

2             *Whereas, Norma received the Chief Anderson Award from*  
3 *the city of Anderson as well as the Older Hoosier of the Year*  
4 *award from LifeStream Inc. in 2005;*

5             *Whereas, She was a devout member of Congregation Beth-*  
6 *El Zedeck;*

7             *Whereas, Norma was a person who always spoke her mind,*  
8 *but also treated all with whom she came in contact with respect*  
9 *and warmth, was always a trusted friend, confidant and*  
10 *counselor, and, therefore, beloved by her community;*

11            *Whereas, She was passionate in addressing the needs of*  
12 *others, especially those less fortunate, in both a public and*  
13 *private fashion*

14            *Whereas, Wherever Norma went, she brought a smile,*  
15 *infectious laugh, and a determination to get answers to her*  
16 *questions; and*

17            *Whereas, Norma is survived by her daughters, Paula*  
18 *Zankel and Ellen Eisen: Therefore,*

19                     *Be it resolved by the Senate of the*  
20                     *General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

21            SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate memorializes Norma  
22 Schlossberg.
