## HOUSE BILL No. 2421

## By Representative Williams

## 10-31

1 AN ACT concerning persons with disabilities; relating to the right to 2 accommodation for individuals who raise assistance dogs; the 3 procedure for verification of a person's right to be accompanied by an 4 assistance dog or professional therapy dog; accredited training 5 facilities; amending K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 39-1109, 39-1111 and 39-1113 6 and repealing the existing sections.

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## Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

9 Section 1. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 39-1109 is hereby amended to read as 10 follows: 39-1109. Any-professional trainer, from a recognized training 11 center, of an assistance dog, while engaged in the training of such dog, 12 shall have the right to be accompanied by such dog in or upon any of the 13 places listed in K.S.A. 39-1101, and amendments thereto, without being 14 required to pay an extra charge for such dog. Such trainer shall be liable 15 for any damage done to the premises of facilities by such dog.

K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 39-1111 is hereby amended to read as 16 Sec. 2. follows: 39-1111. (a) If a question arises as to whether an assistance dog 17 18 qualifies under this act to accompany a person with a disability in or upon 19 any place set forth in K.S.A. 39-1101, and amendments thereto, the person 20 with a disability may produce for the employee or person responsible for 21 such place an identification card or letter credentials conforming to the 22 requirements of this subsection. Upon production of such-identification 23 eard or letter *credentials*, the assistance dog shall be allowed to accompany 24 the person with a disability in or upon such place.

(1) If the assistance dog has been trained by a training facility, school
 or trainer an accredited training facility, the identification card or letter
 credentials shall be provided by the accredited training facility, school or
 trainer that trained the dog and shall contain the following information:

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(A) The legal name of the dog's user;

30 (B) the name, address and telephone number of the *accredited* 31 *training* facility<del>, school or trainer who</del> *that* trained the dog;

32 (C) whether the dog is designated as a guide, hearing assistance or 33 service dog; and

(D) a picture or digital photographic likeness of the dog user and the
 dog. If a card is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness shall be
 on the card. If a letter is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness

1 shall either be printed as a part of the letter or be affixed to the letter.

2 (2) If the assistance dog has been trained by the person using the dog, 3 the identification card or letter credentials shall contain the following 4 information:

5 6 (A) The legal name of the dog's user; the dog user's address; (B)

7 a statement that the dog has been trained to mitigate the dog (C) 8 user's disability; and

9 (D) a picture or digital photographic likeness of the dog user and the dog. If a card is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness shall be 10 on the card. If a letter is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness 11 12 shall either be printed as a part of the letter or be affixed to the letter.

(b) If a question arises as to whether a dog handler is qualified, or 13 whether the dog accompanying the handler is qualified as a professional 14 therapy dog, to enter in or upon the places any place set forth in K.S.A. 15 16 2019 Supp. 39-1110, and amendments thereto, an employee or person responsible for such-places place may request, and the qualified handler 17 shall produce, an identification card or letter, credentials provided by the 18 19 an unaccredited or accredited training facility, school or trainer who 20 trained the dog. Such-eard or letter credentials shall contain the following 21 information:

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(1) The legal name of the qualified dog handler;

23 (2) the name, address and telephone number of the facility, school or 24 trainer who trained the dog;

25 (3) information documenting that the dog is trained to provide 26 therapeutic supports: and

(4) a picture or digital photographic likeness of the qualified handler 27 28 and the dog. If a card is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness 29 shall be on the eard. If a letter is used, the picture or digital photographic likeness shall either be printed as a part of the letter or be affixed to the 30 31 letter.

32 (c) If a question arises as to whether an individual accompanied by a 33 dog is a professional trainer, from a recognized training center, of an assistance dog, in order to enter in or upon-a any place set forth in K.S.A. 34 39-1101, and amendments thereto, an employee or person responsible for 35 such place may request, and the trainer shall produce, an identification 36 37 eard credentials provided by the recognized an accredited training-center 38 *facility* containing the following information: (1) The legal name of the trainer;

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40 (2) the name, address and telephone number of the accredited 41 training-center facility;

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- (3) the address and telephone number of the training center;

43 (4) the types of functions for which dogs are trained by the center 1 *accredited training facility*; and

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(5)(4) a picture or digital photographic likeness of the trainer.

3 (d) An identification card or letter*Credentials that are* produced for 4 inspection pursuant to this section shall be promptly returned to the person 5 with a disability, the qualified handler or the professional trainer after 6 inspection.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 39-1113 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 39-1113. As used in this act and in K.S.A. 39-1101 through 39<u>1109</u> et seq., and amendments thereto:

10 (a) "Accredited training facility" means an assistance dog training 11 organization that is accredited by assistance dogs international or a 12 similar internationally recognized institution whose main purpose is to 13 grant accreditation to assistance dog organizations based on standards of 14 excellence in all areas of assistance dog acquisition, training and 15 placement.

(b) "Assistance dog" means any guide dog, hearing assistance dog or
service dog. The presence of a dog for comfort, protection or personal
defense does not qualify a dog as being trained to mitigate an individual's
disability and therefor does not qualify the dog as an assistance dog
covered under the provisions of this act.

21 (b)(c) "Guide dog" means a dog-which that is being prepared to be or 22 has been specially selected, trained and tested by an accredited training 23 facility for the purpose of guiding a person who is legally blind.

(e)(d) "Hearing assistance dog" means a dog-which that is being
 prepared to be or has been specially selected, trained and tested by an
 accredited training facility to alert or warn individuals who are deaf or
 hard of hearing to specific sounds.

28 (d)(e) "Professional therapy dog" means a dog-which that is selected, 29 trained and tested by an unaccredited or accredited training facility, 30 school or trainer to provide specific physical or therapeutic functions, 31 under the direction and control of a qualified handler who works with the 32 dog as a team, and as a part of the handler's occupation or profession. Such 33 dogs, with their handlers, perform such functions in institutional settings, 34 community based group settings, or when providing services to specific persons who have disabilities. "Professional therapy dog" does not include 35 36 dogs, certified or not, which that are used by volunteers for pet visitation 37 therapy.

38 (c)(f) "Service dog" means a dog-which that is being prepared to be 39 or has been specially selected, trained and tested by an accredited training 40 facility to perform a variety of tasks for persons with disabilities. These 41 tasks include, but are not limited to: Pulling wheelchairs; lending balance 42 support; picking up dropped objects-or; providing assistance in, or to 43 avoid, a medical crisis; or to otherwise mitigate the effects of a disability.

(f) The presence of a dog for comfort, protection or personal defense 1 does not qualify a dog as being trained to mitigate an individual's disability and therefor does not qualify the dog as an assistance dog covered under 2 3 the provisions of this act. 4

- (g) "Trainer" means an employee or volunteer of an accredited 5 training facility who trains or raises assistance dogs. Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 39-1109, 39-1111 and 39-1113 are hereby 6

- Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 9 publication in the statute book. 10
