## AN ACT requiring the display of the national motto in public buildings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
Section 1. (a) If sufficient funds are available pursuant to subsection (c), the governing body, or chief administrative officer if no governing body exists, of each public building shall prominently display in a conspicuous place a durable poster or framed image of the national motto in accordance with subsection (b).
(b) (1) The display required under subsection (a) shall contain:
(A) The national motto of the United States: "In God We Trust" and "E Pluribus Unum";
(B) an accurate representation of the flag of the United States; and
(C) an accurate representation of the flag of the state of Kansas.
(2) The national motto shall be displayed in a large font size on an easily readable poster or framed image that is at least 11 inches wide by 14 inches high and shall be the central focus of such display.
(c) Displays required by this section shall be donated or shall be purchased by each governing body, or chief administrative officer if no governing body exists, solely with funds made available through voluntary contributions for such purpose.
(d) As used in this section:
(1) "Municipality" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 75-6102, and amendments thereto;
(2) "state" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 75-6102, and amendments thereto; and
(3) "public building" means a building owned or leased by the state or a municipality. "Public building" does not include a building owned by the state or a municipality that is leased by a private entity whether for profit or not-for-profit or a building held in title by the state or a municipality solely for reasons of revenue bond financing.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
