1 2	AN ACT concerning adult care homes; requiring written informed consent before administering an antipsychotic medication to an adult care home
3	resident.
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5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
6	Section 1. (a) (1) "Adult care home" means the same as defined in
7	K.S.A. 39-923, and amendments thereto, but does not include nursing
8	facilities for mental health or intermediate care facilities for people with
9	intellectual disability.
10	(2) "Antipsychotic" means those medications included in the United
11	States pharmacopeia's antipsychotic therapeutic category.
12	(3) "Department" means the Kansas department for aging and
13	disability services.
14	(4) "Incapacitated" means being unable to receive and evaluate
15	information effectively or to communicate decisions to such an extent that
16	the resident lacks the capacity to manage such resident's healthcare
17	decisions.
18	(5) "Informed consent" means receiving permission from a resident,
19	or a person acting on behalf of the resident, after such resident or person is
20	presented with:
21	(A) The specific issue;
22	(B) the recommended treatment;
23	(C) the resident's specific mental or physical status with regard to the
24	problem issue;
25	(D) any risks regarding treating or not treating the problem issue;
26	(E) acceptable alternatives of treatment to the problem issue;
27	(F) the right to refuse treatment; and
28	(G) possible consequences risked by refusal.
29	(6) "Person acting on behalf of the resident" means a guardian of the
30	resident, as defined in K.S.A. 59-3051, and amendments thereto, an agent
31	acting in accordance with a durable power of attorney for health care
32	decisions executed by the resident pursuant to K.S.A. 58-625 et seq., and
33	amendments thereto, or an individual acting in accordance with a living
34	will lawfully executed by the resident.
35	(6) "Prescriber" means the same as defined in K.S.A. 65-1626, and

1 amendments thereto.

2 (7) "Resident" means any individual kept, cared for, treated, boarded 3 or otherwise accommodated in any adult care home.

4 (b) Any prescriber who prescribes an antipsychotic medication to an 5 adult care home resident shall notify the adult care home if the prescribed 6 medication has a boxed warning under 21 C.F.R. 201.57.

7 (c) (1) Except as provided below, before an antipsychotic medication 8 that has a boxed warning under 21 C.F.R. 201.57 is administered to a 9 resident of an adult care home, a prescriber shall obtain written informed 10 consent from the resident or, if the resident is incapacitated, a person 11 acting on behalf of the resident, on a form provided by the department or 12 on a form that contains the same information as the form described below.

(2) The department shall make available on its website or by mail
 multiple, drug-specific forms for obtaining informed consent under this
 section for the administration of antipsychotic medications that contain all
 of the following:

17 (A) A space for a description of the benefits of the proposed 18 treatment and the way the medication will be administered;

(B) a description, using the most recently issued information from the
 United States food and drug administration, of the side effects or risks of
 side effects of the medication and any warnings about the medication;

22 (C) a space for a description of any alternative treatment modes or 23 medications;

(D) a space for a description of the probable consequences of notreceiving the medication;

(E) a space for indicating the specific time period, if any, when the
resident or the person acting on behalf of the resident wishes the informed
consent to be effective;

(F) a statement that the resident or a person acting on behalf of theresident may withdraw informed consent, in writing, at any time;

(G) a declaration that the resident or a person acting on behalf of the
resident has been provided with specific, complete and accurate
information and time to study the information or to seek additional
information concerning the medication;

(H) a space for the signature of the prescriber and the date of signing;and

(I) a space for the signature of the resident, or a person acting onbehalf of the resident, and the date of signing.

39 (3) Written informed consent provided by a guardian is subject to the40 requirements of K.S.A. 59-3075, and amendments thereto.

41 (4) Upon receiving written informed consent from a resident or a
42 person acting on behalf of the resident, a prescriber shall send a copy of
43 the completed informed consent form to the adult care home. The adult

care home shall place a copy of the resident's completed informed consent
 form in such resident's chart. Upon request, the adult care home shall give

the resident or a person acting on behalf of the resident a copy of thecompleted informed consent form.

5 (5) Written informed consent obtained under this subsection is valid 6 until withdrawn or until any specific time period listed on the informed 7 consent form by the resident, or a person acting on behalf of the resident, 8 has passed.

9 (6) The resident, or a person acting on behalf of the resident, may 10 withdraw consent, in writing, at any time.

(7) At the time the resident or a person acting on behalf of the
resident signs the informed consent form, the prescriber shall verbally
inform the resident or the person acting on behalf of the resident of all of
the following:

(A) That the resident, or a person acting on behalf of the resident,may withdraw consent, in writing, at any time; and

17 (B) that written informed consent obtained under this subsection is 18 valid until withdrawn or until any specific time period indicated on the 19 informed consent form by the resident or a person acting on behalf of the 20 resident has passed.

(8) No person may retaliate against or threaten to retaliate against the
 resident or a person acting on behalf of the resident for refusing to provide
 or withdrawing consent.

(9) The prescriber shall use the most current written informed consent
forms available from the department or shall update such prescriber's own
forms with the most current information about the medications available
from the department.

(d) (1) An adult care home shall not be required to obtain written
 informed consent before administering an antipsychotic medication to a
 resident under subsection (c) if the following apply:

(A) The resident is subject to court-ordered treatment that includesthe administration of antipsychotic medications; or

(B) (i) there is an emergency in which the resident is at significant
risk of physical or emotional harm or the resident puts any other individual
at significant risk of physical or emotional harm and when time and
distance preclude obtaining written informed consent before administering
an antipsychotic medication; and

(ii) the physician, advanced practice registered nurse or physician
assistant caring for the resident has determined that the resident or others
will be harmed if the antipsychotic medication is not administered before
written informed consent is obtained.

42 (2) Any verbal consent obtained under subparagraph (B) shall be 43 entered in the resident's medical record and shall be valid for 10 days, after which time the adult care home may not continue to administer the
 antipsychotic medication, unless the adult care home has obtained a copy
 of the written informed consent form according to subsection (c).

(3) If subparagraph (B) applies, the resident is incapacitated and the
adult care home has made a good faith effort to obtain verbal consent
under paragraph (2) from a person acting on behalf of the resident but has
been unable to contact such a person, the adult care home may administer
the antipsychotic medication to the resident for up to 24 hours before
obtaining consent under paragraph (1) or subsection (c).

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(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to otherwise limit:

(1) A prescriber's authority to prescribe or provide treatment to a
 patient in accordance with applicable standards of care or licensing
 provisions found in the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments
 thereto, or any rules and regulations adopted thereunder; or

15 (2) a resident's right of access to an antipsychotic drug prescribed by 16 a licensed prescriber and administered for the purpose of treating a 17 diagnosed behavioral health condition.

18 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its19 publication in the statute book.
