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A JOINT RESOLUTION declaring May 17th as Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma

- WHEREAS, diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma (DIPG) affects 200 to 400 children in
- 4 the United States each year; and
- 5 WHEREAS, brain tumors are the leading cause of cancer-related death in children;
- 6 and
- WHEREAS, DIPG is the leading cause of childhood death due to brain tumors; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the median survival time with DIPG is only nine months with
- 9 treatment; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the chance of surviving for five years is less than one percent; and
- WHEREAS, prognosis has not improved for children with DIPG in more than 40
- 12 years;
- NOW, THEREFORE,
- 14 Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The Senate hereby declares May 17th as Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine
- 16 Glioma (DIPG) Awareness Day in Kentucky.
- The Senate encourages the citizens of the Commonwealth of
- 18 Kentucky to become more informed about DIPG.
- → Section 3. When the Senate adjourns this day, it does so in honor of all those
- 20 Kentuckians who are suffering with DIPG and their families.
