PROPERTY/IMMOVABLE: Removes certain restrictions on the disposal of immovable property by the governing authority of Slidell

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 48:720, relative to the disposal of immovable property by the
3 governing authority of Slidell; to remove certain restrictions on the disposal of
4 immovable property by the governing authority of Slidell; and to provide for related
5 matters.

6 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
7 as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
8 Louisiana.

9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

10 Section 1. R.S. 48:720 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

11 §720. Disposal of immovable property by the governing authority of St. Tammany
12 Parish ~~or Slidell~~

13 A. The governing authority of St. Tammany Parish ~~and the governing~~
14 ~~authority of the city of Slidell~~ shall not dispose of any immovable property pursuant
15 to this Part unless such property has been held by said governing authority for at
16 least ten years.

17 B. The disposition of any immovable property by the governing authority of
18 St. Tammany Parish ~~or the governing authority of the city of Slidell~~ pursuant to this
19 Part shall not have the effect of denying access to such property to any person.

Abstract: Removes restrictions on the disposal of immovable property by the governing authority of Slidell.

Present law prohibits the governing authority of St. Tammany Parish and Slidell from disposing of immovable property held by the governing authority for a minimum of 10 years.

Proposed law removes the governing authority of Slidell from the restrictions in present law.
