TRANSPORTATION: Establishes a driver's license designation for a person with autism spectrum disorder

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 32:412(Section heading) and (P) and to enact R.S. 32:412(Q),
relative to criteria for the establishment of a special license plate designation; to
provide for a special license plate designation indicating that a person has autism
spectrum disorder; to provide penalties for false statements concerning an autism
spectrum disorder designation; to require the implementation of a law enforcement
officer training course; to provide for the promulgation of rules and regulations; and
to provide for related matters.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 32:412(Section heading) and (P) are hereby amended and reenacted
and R.S. 32:412(Q) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
§412. Amount of fees; credit or refund; duration of license; veteran designation;
disabled veteran designation; university logo; "I'm a Cajun" designation;
needs accommodation designation; autism spectrum disorder designation;
disbursement of funds; renewal by mail or electronic commerce of Class "D"
or "E" drivers' licenses; disposition of certain fees; exception
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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

P.(1) Upon request of an applicant for a driver's license, a designation that
the applicant has autism spectrum disorder shall be exhibited on the driver's license
upon presentation of a statement from a qualified medical or mental health
professional licensed in Louisiana or any other state or territory of the United States
verifying the applicant's disability as established by administrative rule. The
qualified medical or mental health professional shall be authorized to diagnose
autism spectrum disorder. No additional fee shall be charged to include such
designation.
(2) Upon the renewal of a driver's license, a driver who has autism spectrum
disorder shall provide a statement from a qualified medical or mental health
professional licensed in Louisiana or any other state or territory of the United States
verifying his disability as established by administrative rule.
(3) Any person who has not been diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder
who willfully and falsely represents himself as having the qualifications to obtain the
special designation authorized by this Section shall be fined not less than one
hundred dollars nor more than two hundred fifty dollars, or shall be imprisoned for
not more than thirty days, or both. Any subsequent offense shall result in a fine of
not less than two hundred fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or
imprisonment for not more than ninety days, or both.
(4) In addition to the requirements of R.S. 40:2404.2(C), the Department of
Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, shall establish and implement
a law enforcement training course relative to law enforcement officers' interaction
with persons who have autism spectrum disorder. The course shall instruct law
enforcement officers on sensitivity and awareness to ensure equitable treatment and
how to effectively communicate and interact with persons with autism spectrum
disorder. At a minimum, the course shall include the following:
(a) Identification of indicators that a person has autism spectrum disorder.
(b) Identification of procedures that an officer should employ when
encountering a person with autism spectrum disorder.

1	(c) Demonstrations of communication and interactive techniques required
2	to effectively interact with a person with autism spectrum disorder.
3	(d) Explanations that provide law enforcement officers with an
4	understanding of the developmental disability and examples of unexpected actions
5	potentially taken by persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder.
6	(e) Explanations of the resources available to assist an officer encountering
7	a person who has autism spectrum disorder.
8	(f) Descriptions of the procedures an officer should use to ensure compliance
9	with the Americans with Disabilities Act when encountering a person with autism
10	spectrum disorder.
11	(5) The deputy secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,
12	public safety services, shall promulgate rules and regulations as necessary to
13	implement the provisions of this Subsection, including a waiver of liability for the
14	release of any medical information. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S.
15	49:968(B)(12), the House and Senate committees on transportation, highways and
16	public works shall have oversight of the adoption of rules and regulations required
17	by this Subsection.
18	P. Q. An applicant for any class of license may choose to donate one dollar
19	in addition to any license fee required by this Section to the Louisiana Military
20	Family Assistance Fund.

Abstract: Establishes an autism spectrum disorder designation for a person's driver's license.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes an applicant for a driver's license who has autism spectrum disorder to request a designation and requires the designation to be placed on his driver's license.

Proposed law requires the applicant to provide a sworn statement from a qualified medical or mental health professional licensed in La. or any U.S. state or territory verifying his disability and prohibits any additional fee for the designation.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words underscored are additions.

REENGROSSED HB NO. 317

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a driver who has autism spectrum disorder to provide a statement from a qualified medical or mental health professional licensed in La. or any other U.S. state or territory verifying the disability upon the renewal of his driver's license.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the qualified medical or mental health professional must be authorized to diagnose autism spectrum disorder.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that any person who willfully and falsely represents himself as having the qualifications to obtain the special designation authorized by <u>proposed law</u> be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$250, or be imprisoned for not more than 30 days, or both. Specifies that a subsequent offense will result in a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500, or imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, to establish and implement a law enforcement training course relative to law enforcement officers' interactions with persons who have autism spectrum disorder, in addition to the requirements of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the course to instruct law enforcement officers on sensitivity and awareness to ensure equitable treatment and how to effectively communicate and interact with persons who have autism spectrum disorder.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the course to include identification of indicators that a person has autism spectrum disorder; identification of procedures that an officer should employ when encountering a person who has autism spectrum disorder; demonstrations of communication and interactive techniques required to effectively interact with a person who has autism spectrum disorder; explanations that provide law enforcement officers with an understanding of developmental disabilities and examples of unexpected actions potentially taken by persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder; explanations of the resources available to assist an officer encountering a person who has autism spectrum disorder; and descriptions of the procedures an officer should use to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act when encountering a person who has autism spectrum disorder.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the deputy secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to promulgate rules and regulations to implement the provisions of <u>proposed law</u>. Provides rule oversight authority to the House and Senate committees on transportation, highways and public works.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Transportation</u>, <u>Highways and Public Works</u> to the <u>original bill</u>:

1. Make technical changes.

#### The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Change "autism" to "autism spectrum disorder" throughout the bill.
- 2. Clarify that the verifying statement provided by an applicant to receive the special designation may come from a medical or mental health professional and require the medical or mental health professional be qualified to diagnose autism spectrum disorder.
