REAPPORTIONMENT/JUDGES: Provides for election sections in the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit (Item \#7)


#### Abstract

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 13:312(3)(b)(i) and 312.1(C), relative to the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit; to provide election sections for the election of judges to the first district of the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit; to provide for the assignment of judgeships for election purposes; to provide for the election of judges; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.


Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 13:312(3)(b)(i) and 312.1(C) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
§312. Courts of appeal; circuits and districts
There shall be five court of appeal circuits, which shall be subdivided into districts as follows:
3.
(b) Districts of third circuit.
(i) The parishes of Avoyelles, Catahoula, Concordia, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, and Sabine shall compose the first district of the third circuit. The first district shall be further divided into two election sections.
(aa) Election section one shall be composed of Avoyelles Parish; Catahoula Parish; Concordia Parish; Precincts 1-1, 1-2, 1-3, 2-2, 2-3, 4-1, 4-2, 5-1, 5-2, 6-1, 6-2, 6-3, 7-1, 7-2, 7-3, 7-4, 8-1, 8-2 and 8-3 of Grant Parish; La Salle Parish; Precincts 4-6 and 4-7 of Natchitoches Parish; Precincts C22, C23, N5, N6, N7, N8,

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N9, N10, N11, N12, N13, N14, N15, N16, N17, N18, N19, N20, N21, N22, N23, N24, N25, N26, N27, N28, N29, S2, S7, S8, S9, S10, S11, S13, S14, S15, S16, S17, S18, S19, S20, S21, S22, S23, S24, S25, S26, S27, S28 and S29 of Rapides Parish and Sabine Parish.<br>(bb) Election section two shall be composed of Precincts 2-1, 3-1, 3-2 and 3-3 of Grant Parish; Precincts 1-1, 1-1A, 1-2, 1-3, 1-3A, 1-4, 1-4A, 1-4B, 1-5, 1-5A, $1-6,1-7,1-8,1-9,1-9 \mathrm{~A}, 1-10,1-10 \mathrm{~A}, 1-10 \mathrm{~B}, 1-11,1-12,1-13,1-14,2-1,2-2,2-3$, 2-4, 2-5, 2-6, 2-7, 2-7A, 2-8, 2-9, 3-1, 3-2, 3-3, 3-4, 3-5, 3-6, 3-7, 3-8, 3-9, 3-10, 4-1, 4-2, 4-3, 4-4, 4-5, 4-8 and 4-9 of Natchitoches Parish and Precincts C1, C2, C3, C4, $\mathrm{C} 5, \mathrm{C} 6, \mathrm{C} 7, \mathrm{C} 8, \mathrm{C} 9, \mathrm{C} 10, \mathrm{C} 11, \mathrm{C} 13, \mathrm{C} 14, \mathrm{C} 15, \mathrm{C} 17, \mathrm{C} 18, \mathrm{C} 19, \mathrm{C} 20, \mathrm{C} 21, \mathrm{C} 24, \mathrm{C} 25$, C26, C27, C28, C30, C31, C32, C33, C34, C35, C36, C37, C38, C39, C40, C41, C42, N1, N2, N3, N4, S1, S4, S5 and S6 of Rapides Parish.


§312.1. Circuit court of appeal; domicile; number of judges; election
C. The Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit, domiciled in the city of Lake Charles, shall have twelve judges. Three judges shall be elected from the first district at large by the qualifiedelectors thereof by electing two judges from election section one and by electing one judge from election section two of the first district as provided in R.S. 13:312(3); three judges shall be elected from the second district by electing one judge from election section one and by electing two judges from election section two of the second district as provided in R.S. 13:312(3); and six judges shall be elected from the third district by electing one judge from each of the five election sections as provided in R.S. 13:312(3), and by electing one judge from the third district at large.

Section 2.(A) The precincts referenced in this Act are those precincts identified as Voting Districts (VTDs) in the 2010 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the State of Louisiana.

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(B) When a precinct referenced in this Act has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 18:532.1, the enumeration in this Act of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof, however such subdivisions may be designated. The territorial limits of the election sections as provided in this Act shall continue in effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.

Section 3.(A) The judgeships currently designated as Division B and Division C of the first district of the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit are hereby assigned to election section one for election purposes.
(B) The judgeship currently designated as Division A of the first district of the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit is hereby assigned to election section two for election purposes.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

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Proposed law divides the first district into two election sections. Provides that two judges are elected from election section one and that one judge is elected from election section two. Provides that the judgeships currently designated as Division B and Division C of the first district are assigned to election section one for election purposes. Provides that the judgeship currently designated as Division A of the first district is assigned to election section two for election purposes.

Proposed law specifies that the precincts referenced in proposed law are those precincts identified as Voting Districts (VTDs) in the 2010 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the state of La. Provides that when a precinct referenced in proposed law has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with the provisions of present law (R.S. 18:532.1), the enumeration in proposed law of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof, however such subdivisions may be designated. Provides that the territorial limits of the election sections as provided in proposed law shall continue in effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.

[^0]:    Abstract: Divides the first district of the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit into two election sections and assigns judgeships to the election sections.

    Statistical summaries of proposed law as well as maps illustrating proposed district boundaries accompany this digest. (Attached to hard copies of the bill distributed during session and available as a separate document on the Internet.)

    Present law provides that the first district of the Court of Appeal for the Third Circuit is comprised of Avoyelles, Catahoula, Concordia, Grant, LaSalle, Natchitoches, Rapides, and Sabine parishes. Provides that three judges are elected at large from the first district.
