AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 26:271.2(introductory paragraph) and to enact R.S. 26:271.2(5),
3	relative to Class A retail permits for beverages of low alcoholic content; to authorize
4	a caterer's permit for certain facilities; to provide for rulemaking; and to provide for
5	related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 26:271.2(introductory paragraph) is hereby amended and reenacted
8	and R.S. 26:271.2(5) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§271.2. Class A permit; definitions
10	The commissioner shall issue the following four five types of Class A retail
11	permits for beverages of low alcoholic content:

13	(5) Class A-Caterer:
14	(a) The primary purpose shall be to sell and serve alcoholic beverages at
15	retail on the premises of an establishment that is not otherwise licensed pursuant to
16	this Title.
17	(b) The commissioner shall adopt rules in accordance with the
18	Administrative Procedure Act establishing any additional requirements applicable
19	to a Class A-Caterer's permit.

Abramson HB No. 429

Abstract: Authorizes the issuance of a Class A-Caterer permit for sale of alcoholic beverages at certain facilities.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the issuance of four types of permits for the sale of alcoholic beverages of low alcoholic content for consumption on the premises: Class A-General, Class A-Restaurant, Class A-Special, and Class A-Restaurant-Conditional.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and authorizes the issuance of a Class A-Caterer permit.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commissioner of alcohol and tobacco control shall adopt rules in accordance with the APA to provide for additional criteria for the permit.
