TAX/HOTEL OCCUPANCY: Imposes a per night fee on certain hotel stays

AN ACT

| 2  | To enact Chapter 15 of Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to |
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| 3  | be comprised of R.S. 47:1251, relative to state fees; to impose a fee on hotel               |
| 4  | occupancy; to provide for the amount and collection of the fee; to provide relative          |
| 5  | to the dedication of revenues from the fee; to require rulemaking; to provide for            |
| 6  | effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.   |
| 7  | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:   |
| 8  | Section 1. Chapter 15 of Subtitle II of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of        |
| 9  | 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 47:1251 is hereby enacted to read as follows:                  |
| 0  | CHAPTER 15. MISCELLANEOUS FEES AND TAXES   |
| 1  | §1251. Hotel occupancy fee; imposition; collection; dedication                               |
| 12 | A. On or after July 1, 2017, each hotel in this state shall charge a five dollar             |
| 13 | per night fee to the customer, unless it is an extended stay rental, for each calendar       |
| 4  | day a sleeping room, cottage, or cabin is furnished. The hotel shall collect the fee         |
| 15 | at the time the guest pays for the furnishing of the sleeping room, cottage, or cabin.       |
| 16 | The hotel collecting the fee shall remit the fee on a monthly basis to the Department        |
| 17 | of Revenue.  |
| 18 | B. For purposes of this Section, the following terms shall have the meanings                 |
| 9  | ascribed to them:  |

| 1  | (1) "Extended stay" shall mean any hotel furnishing sleeping rooms,                 |
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| 2  | cottages, or cabins to transient guests for longer than thirty consecutive days.    |
| 3  | (2) "Hotel" shall have the same meaning as provided for in R.S.                     |
| 4  | 47:301(6)(a).   |
| 5  | C. After allocation of the fee proceeds to the Bond Security and Redemption         |
| 6  | Fund as provided for in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, |
| 7  | the remaining monies shall be allocated as follows:                                 |
| 8  | (1) Twenty percent shall be appropriated by the legislature to the Office of        |
| 9  | the Lieutenant Governor for purposes of tourism.                                    |
| 10 | (2) Eighty percent shall be deposited in the Transportation Trust Fund.             |
| 11 | (D) The secretary of the Department of Revenue shall promulgate rules and           |
| 12 | regulations as are necessary to implement the provisions of this Section.           |
| 13 | Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2017.                         |

**Abstract:** Imposes a \$5 per night fee on hotel occupancy.

<u>Proposed law</u>, beginning July 1, 2017, requires that each hotel in this state charge a \$5 per night fee to the customer, unless it is an extended stay rental, for each calendar day a sleeping room, cottage, or cabin is furnished. Fee collections shall be remitted monthly to the Dept. of Revenue.

Proposed law defines "extended stay" and "hotel" for purposes of proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that after allocation of fee proceeds to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund as provided for in <u>present constitution</u>, the monies remaining shall be allocated as follows:

- (1) 20% shall be available for appropriation by the legislature to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor for purposes of tourism.
- (2) 80% shall be deposited in the Transportation Trust Fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the secretary of the Dept. of Revenue to promulgate rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the provisions of <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective July 1, 2017.
