SCHOOLS: (Constitutional Amendment) Grants any legislatively created public school system the same treatment and authority granted to parishes for purposes of minimum foundation program funding and local taxing authority

1	A JOINT RESOLUTION

3	Proposing to amend Article VIII, Section 13(D)(1) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to
4	provide that for certain effects and purposes, any school system created by the
5	legislature shall be regarded and treated as a parish school system, including
6	purposes of funding and the raising of local revenues for the support of elementary
7	and secondary schools; to provide for submission of the proposed amendment to the
8	electors; and to provide for related matters.
9	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
10	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
11	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to
12	amend Article VIII, Section 13(D)(1) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
13	§13. Funding; Apportionment
14	Section 13.
15	* * *
16	(D)(1) Municipal and Other School Systems. For the effects and purposes
17	of this Section, the Central community school system and the Zachary community
18	school system in East Baton Rouge Parish, and the municipalities of Baker in East
19	Baton Rouge Parish, Monroe in Ouachita Parish, and Bogalusa in Washington

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1	Parish, and no others, any other school system created by the legislature shall be
2	regarded and treated as parishes and shall have the authority granted parishes.
3	Consistent with this Article VIII of this constitution, relevant to equal educational
4	opportunities, no state dollars shall be used to discriminate or to have the effect of
5	discriminating in providing equal educational opportunity for all students.

7	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
8	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 5,
9	2024.
10	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,
11	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
12	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
13	follows:
14	Do you support an amendment to provide that all legislatively created school
15	systems are included in the minimum foundation program funding formula
16	for public elementary and secondary schools and have constitutionally
17	granted taxing authority? (Amends Article VIII, Section 13(D)(1))

Abstract: Provides that any legislatively created school system shall be included in the funding formula for public education and has the constitutionally granted authority to levy ad valorem taxes.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides for the inclusion of school systems in the minimum foundation program (MFP) formula for the funding of public elementary and secondary education and for the allocation of MFP funds to such systems. Requires school systems to levy ad valorem taxes and establishes the maximum millage rate for such taxes. Specifically provides that the following community and municipal school systems – and no others – are treated like other school systems for purposes of the MFP and local taxing authority: the Central community school system, the Zachary community school system, and school systems in Baker, Monroe, and Bogalusa.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> but removes the prohibition against any school systems other than those specifically named in <u>present constitution</u> from

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being treated like other school systems. Instead affords any school system created by the legislature the same treatment as other school systems for purposes of the MFP and local taxing authority.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 5, 2024.
