WORKERS COMPENSATION: Provides relative to confidentiality with respect to workers' compensation

an employer and the name of his insurer or membership in a group self-insurance fund as of a specific date. The office of workers' compensation administration shall not provide information which shall allow a requesting party to obtain the identity of all members or insured employers of a particular carrier or group self-insurance fund, either through individual requests or multiple requests. The office of workers' compensation administration shall not provide the effective dates of coverage for a specific employer, or groups of employers, either through individual requests or multiple requests, except to third-party entities providing insurance support organization services for workers' compensation compliance, monitoring, reporting, enforcement, and fraud identification.

**Abstract:** Allows the disclosure of workers' compensation information to certain third party entities who provide insurance support organization services.

<u>Present law</u> requires that all of an employee's medical records, records of payment of compensation, and rehabilitation be kept confidential.

<u>Present law</u> does not prohibit the communication of documents to the employee, his representatives, a prosecuting attorney, state police, public safety, Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, insurance fraud investigation, or to the attorney general of this state.

<u>Present law</u> does not allow the disclosure of the identity of all members or insured employers part of a particular carrier or group fund, or the disclosure of dates for coverage for a specific employer or group of employers. <u>Proposed law</u> provides an exception to <u>present law</u> to allow disclosures to third party entities who provide insurance support organization services for workers' compensation compliance, monitoring, reporting, enforcement, and fraud identification.
