COSMETOLOGY: Provides relative to the practice of advanced esthetics

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 37:563(8), 583(B)(introductory paragraph), (C)(introductory
3	paragraph) and (2), and 595(B)(3) and to enact R.S. 37:563(18) and (19) and 588,
4	relative to the practice of advanced esthetics; to provide for definitions; to provide
5	for certification; to provide for teachers; to provide for training; to provide for
6	instruction; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 37:563(8), 583(B)(introductory paragraph), (C)(introductory
9	paragraph) and (2), and 595(B)(3) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 37:563(18)
10	and (19) and 588 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	§563. Definitions
12	As used in this Chapter, the following words shall have the meaning herein
13	ascribed to them, unless the content clearly otherwise indicates:

15	(8) "Esthetics" means engaging in any one or a combination of the following
16	practices: massaging the face or neck of a person, dyeing or trimming eyebrows,
17	applying natural or artificial enhancements to eyelashes, hair removal by cosmetic
18	preparations, threading, waxing, or other similar means, stimulating, cleansing, or
19	beautifying the face, neck, arms, bust, upper body, legs, or feet skin or scalp of a
20	person by any method with the aid of the hands or of any mechanical or electrical

1	apparatus, including micro-dermabrasion, epidermabrasion, or particle exfoliation
2	using equipment and methodology approved by the board or by the use of a cosmetic
3	preparation; however, esthetics Esthetics shall not include the diagnosis, treatment,
4	or therapy of any dermatological condition, or the process of removing hair known
5	as "electrolysis", or services defined as "advanced esthetics".

7	(18) "Advanced esthetics" means engaging in the practice of esthetics as
8	defined in R.S. 37:563(8), lymphatic drainage, chemical enzyme exfoliation and
9	exfoliations, microdermabrasion, epidermabrasion, particle exfoliation,
10	dermaplaning with a guarded blade, nano infusions, and skin needling of the
11	epidermis. The term shall not include procedures with laser technology prohibited
12	by R.S. 37:1274.1.
13	(19) "Advanced practice esthetician" means a person who practices advanced
14	esthetics.

16	§583. Qualifications for certificate as a registered teacher; continuing education
17	* * *
18	B. In order to receive a certificate of registration as a registered teacher of
19	cosmetology, esthetics, advanced esthetics, or manicuring, a person shall, in addition
20	to the requirements of Subsection C of this Section, meet all of the following
21	requirements:

23	C. In addition to the requirements set forth in Subsection B of this Section,
24	a person shall also meet the following requirements in order to obtain a certificate
25	of registration as a registered teacher of cosmetology, esthetics, advanced esthetics,
26	or manicuring:

28	(2) To obtain a certificate as a registered teacher of esthetics or advanced
29	esthetics, a person shall possess an esthetics or cosmetology certificate, have been

1	actively engaged in the practice of esthetics for at least twelve months prior to
2	beginning the instructor's course, and have successfully passed the examination
3	prescribed by the board for certification as a teacher of esthetics. To obtain a
4	certificate as a registered teacher of advanced esthetics, a person shall possess
5	training in advanced esthetics.

7	§588. Advanced esthetics
8	Beginning on January 1, 2021, a certificate of registration as an advanced
9	practice esthetician shall be issued to any person who can demonstrate training in
10	services within the definition of advanced esthetics and practice in advanced
11	esthetics for at least two years prior to June 30, 2020.

13	§595. Requirements for schools
14	* * *
15	B. All registered cosmetology schools may offer one or more of the
16	following courses, and postsecondary schools shall offer one or more of the
17	following courses only as a postsecondary educational program:
18	* * *
19	(3) A period course of continuing study of practical training and technical
20	instruction in advanced esthetics, including a course of not less than six weeks
21	duration and containing not less than two hundred and fifty hours of study.

<u>Present law</u> defines "esthetics". <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> in part, but adds language to distinguish between "esthetics" and "advanced esthetics".

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

Proposed law defines "advanced esthetics" and "advanced practice esthetics".

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the cosmetology board to offer certificates of registration for cosmetologists, estheticians, and manicurists.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but adds a certificate of registration for advanced estheticians.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the cosmetology board to offer certificates of registration for teachers of cosmetologists, estheticians, and manicurists.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but adds a certificate of registration for teachers of advanced estheticians.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes cosmetology schools to offer continuing education in esthetics, containing not less than 200 hours of study.

<u>Proposed law</u> instead authorizes schools to offer a course of practical training and technical instruction in advanced esthetics containing not less than 250 hours of study.
