impounding livestock; to provide for custody of livestock found at large; to provide

for fees; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 3:2804(A) and (B) and 3004(A) and (B)(1) are hereby amended and

§2804. Impounding livestock found at large upon highways

A. The deputy secretary of Department of Public Safety <u>and Corrections</u> shall, and all sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, constables, <u>marshals</u>, and justices of the peace <u>may shall</u>, cause any livestock found at large upon any highway of the state of Louisiana, as defined in R.S. 3:2803, to be taken into custody and impounded. Any livestock so taken into custody shall be impounded in the nearest official state police impoundment area. Any officer taking custody of and impounding livestock shall immediately notify the deputy secretary of Department of Public Safety <u>and Corrections</u> or his duly authorized representative in the parish in which the livestock is impounded and shall, within twenty-four hours after such notification, notify the owner or manager of such livestock, if known, personally or by leaving written notice at his place of residence.

B. The owner or manager of livestock so impounded shall have the right to secure his livestock upon the payment to the superintendent of state police or officer

impounding the livestock of a fee of twenty dollars per head of livestock. He shall also pay to the officer impounding such livestock the cost of feeding and caring for such livestock at the rate of two six dollars per day for each animal and the cost of any necessary veterinary and advertisement fees incurred.

§3004. Impounding livestock found at large upon highways

A. If the local governing authority has adopted an ordinance under the provisions of this Part, All all sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, constables, marshals, and justices of the peace shall, and any other person may, take possession of and impound any livestock found at large upon any public highway of this state in any ward where livestock is presently prohibited from roaming at large or may hereafter be prohibited from roaming at large as hereinafter provided for. Any livestock so taken and impounded shall be impounded in the parish in which taken and when taken by a sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable, marshal, or justice of the peace, the owner thereof shall be notified personally or by leaving written notice at the place of his residence within twenty-four hours after taking possession of such livestock. Any person other than a sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable, marshal, or justice of the peace taking possession of and impounding livestock shall immediately notify the sheriff of the parish in which the livestock is taken and said sheriff shall, within twenty-four hours of such notification, notify the owner in the manner hereinabove provided.

B.(1) Except as provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, the owner of livestock so taken shall have the right to secure his livestock upon the payment to the officer or person taking up the livestock a fee of ten dollars for each head of livestock taken. He shall also pay to the person taking and impounding such livestock the cost of feeding and caring for such livestock at the rate of two six dollars per day for each animal.

Hensgens HB No. 72

Abstract: Requires marshals to take custody of and impound any livestock found at large upon certain state highways.

<u>Present law</u> requires the deputy secretary of DPS&C, and allows all sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, constables, and justices of the peace to take custody of and impound any livestock found roaming at large upon certain state highways. Provides that the impounding officer immediately notify the deputy secretary of the department or his authorized representative in the parish in which the livestock is impounded.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, constables, and justices of the peace to take custody of and impound any livestock found roaming at large upon certain state highways and adds marshals.

<u>Present law</u> allows the owner of impounded livestock to secure his livestock upon payment of \$20 per head and the cost of feeding and caring for such livestock at the rate of \$2 per day for each animal.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the daily cost of feeding and caring for each animal <u>from</u> \$2 <u>to</u> \$6. <u>Present law</u> requires all sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, constables, and justices of the peace, and allows other persons to take possession of and impound livestock found roaming at large in any ward where currently or hereafter prohibited from roaming at large. Provides for impoundment of the livestock in the parish where taken. Further provides for notification within 24 hours of impoundment.

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies the adoption of an ordinance by the local governing authority on the impoundment of certain roaming livestock and adds marshals.

<u>Present law</u> allows the owner of impounded livestock to secure his livestock upon payment of \$10 per head and cost of feeding and caring for such livestock at the rate of \$2 per day for each animal.

Proposed law increases the daily rate of feeding and caring for each animal from \$2 to \$6.
