13	(2) The provisions of this Subsection shall apply to owners of commercial
14	recreational developments, or facilities, or their agents or assignees for injury to
15	persons or property arising out of the commercial recreational activity permitted at
16	the recreational development or facility that occurs on land which does not comprise
17	the commercial recreational development or facility and over which the owner has
18	no control when the recreational activity commences, occurs, or terminates on the
19	commercial recreational development or facility.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include an agent or assignee of the owner of the recreational land development.
