A RESOLUTION

To commend the 2017 International Legislative Drafting Institute participants and to welcome them to the state capitol.

WHEREAS, the Public Law Center, a joint venture of the Loyola and Tulane law schools, launched the International Legislative Drafting Institute in 1995 in response to increasing global demand for training of legislative drafters; and

WHEREAS, the institute is a two-week summer program that responds to the worldwide demand on legislative drafters for new laws to support the emergence of free market economies and democratic forms of government and draws together diverse domestic and international faculty members experienced in the legislative process; and
