2	To enact R.S. 40:2405.8(J), relative to peace officer training requirements; to require

5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 40:2405.8(J) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§2405.8. Additional peace officer training requirements
8	* * *
9	J.(1) The council shall develop and continuously update trauma-
10	informed training materials related to domestic violence, sexual assault, and sex
11	trafficking in its basic and in-service training curriculums.
12	(2) For the purposes of this Subsection, trauma-informed materials shall
13	include skills, practices, and leadership relating only to domestic violence,
14	sexual assault, and sex trafficking.
15	(3) The initial orientation to sex trafficking trauma-informed training
16	shall be classroom instruction, and shall be conducted at a P.O.S.T. accredited
17	academy or a P.O.S.T. approved training center. The council may designate an

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1	alternative method for delivery of the training when otherwise not logistically
2	feasible.
3	(4) All peace officers employed on August 1, 2024, who have been
4	employed for one year or more, shall complete the training within one year after
5	the curriculum has been developed and approved by the council.
6	(5) The trauma-informed training and materials required by this
7	Subsection shall not include materials relating to diversity, equity, and inclusion
8	practices or policies.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T. or council) to develop and continuously update trauma-informed training materials related to domestic violence, sexual assault, and sex trafficking in its basic and in-service training curriculums.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that trauma-informed materials include skills, practices, and leadership only to domestic violence, sexual assault, and sex trafficking.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the initial orientation to sex trafficking trauma-informed training be classroom instruction, and be conducted at a P.O.S.T. accredited academy or a P.O.S.T. approved training center. <u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the council to designate an alternative method for delivery of the training when otherwise not logistically feasible.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all peace officers employed on August 1, 2024, who have been employed for one year or more, to complete the training within one year after the curriculum has been developed and approved by the council.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that trauma-informed training materials be prohibited from including materials relating to diversity, equity, and inclusion practices or policies.

Effective August 1, 2024.
