STUDENTS. Prohibits the use of corporal punishment for certain students with exceptionalities. (gov sig)

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| 2 | To amend and reenact R.S. 17:223(A), 416.1(B), and 3996(B)(2), relative to student |
| 3 | discipline; to prohibit the use of corporal punishment in public elementary and |
| 4 | secondary schools for students with exceptionalities, except gifted and talented |
| 5 | students; and to provide for related matters. |
| 6 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 7 | Section 1. R.S. 17:223(A), 416.1(B), and 3996(B)(2) are hereby amended and |
| 8 | reenacted to read as follows: |
| 9 | §223. Discipline of pupils; suspension from school, corporal punishment |
| 10 | A. Every teacher is authorized to hold every pupil to a strict accountability |
| 11 | for any disorderly conduct in school or on the playground of the school, or on any |
| 12 | school bus going to or returning from school, or during intermission or recess. Each |
| 13 | parish and city school board shall have discretion in the use of corporal punishment. |
| 14 | In those cases in which a parish or city school board decides to use corporal |
| 15 | punishment, each parish or city school board shall adopt such rules and regulations |
| 16 | as it deems necessary to implement and control any form of corporal punishment in |
| 17 | the schools in its district. |

| 19 | Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be |
| 20 | exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are |

<u>Present law</u> allows local school boards discretion in the use of corporal punishment for students and requires the boards to adopt rules and regulations to implement and control its use.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the administration of corporal punishment to students with exceptionalities, except gifted and talented students, and makes <u>present law</u> and <u>proposed</u> <u>law</u> applicable to charter schools.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
