WHEREAS, it is appropriate to commend the Sigma Chapter of Delta Zeta at 6 7 Louisiana State University for its outstanding achievements in academics and extracurricular 8 activities as well as generous philanthropic and community service to the Baton Rouge 9 community since its founding on November 24, 1917; and 10 WHEREAS, Delta Zeta Sorority was founded on October 24, 1902, at Miami 11 University in Oxford, Ohio, when six courageous young women joined together to form a social sorority with a vision of lifetime sisterhood fostered by ideals they cherished; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Delta Zeta was the first sorority to be founded at Miami University, and 14 the six founders laid a foundation for the sorority that would have a national reach; and WHEREAS, Alfa Lloyd, Mary Collins, Anna Keen, Julia Bishop, Mabelle Minton, 15 and Anne Simmons bonded together as they faced the challenges of starting a sorority on a 16 male-dominated campus, as women had just been given full status as students at Miami 17 University, and met with Dr. Guy Potter Benton, president of the university, to make their 18

WHEREAS, the Chapter has generously supported Alzheimer's Services of the Capitol Area and the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center, and on the national level, the Sigma Chapter financially supports the Painted Turtle Camp and the Starkey Hearing Foundation; and
