A RESOLUTION

To urge and request the Senate Committee on Judiciary A to study and make recommendations with respect to the advisability of creating a statewide business court.

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana has experienced exponential growth in business and industry; and

WHEREAS, the legal issues arising in the daily activities of business and industry are often complex, requiring specialized legal knowledge; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Louisiana would benefit from the creation of a statewide business court with jurisdiction over matters which arise in business and industry; and

WHEREAS, there are many benefits of creating specialized courts, and particularly a business court.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Senate Committee on Judiciary A to study and make recommendations on the advisability of creating a statewide business court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall make a report of its findings and recommendations, with a suggestion for proposed legislation, if any, to the president of the Senate by February 1, 2021.
