Mark and others relative to establishing within the Department of Transitional Assistance an agricultural healthy incentives program operated in partnership with the Department of Agricultural Resources and the Department of Public Health. Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to an agricultural healthy incentives program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 128 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after

2 section 2E the following section:-

3	Section 2F. (a)There shall be within the Department of Transitional Assistance a
4	healthy incentives program operated in partnership with the Department of Agricultural
5	Resources and the Department of Public Health. The program shall provide that for every dollar
6	of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits, established pursuant to the Food and
7	Nutrition Act of 2008, 7 U.S.C. section 2011 hereinafter referred to as SNAP, redeemed for fruit
8	and vegetable purchases, either fresh, canned, dried or frozen, by a SNAP recipient, the recipient
9	shall receive a matching benefit reimbursed on the recipient's EBT card of one dollar, within
10	limits to be established by the department.

11	(b) There shall be established and set up on the books of the
12	commonwealth a separate fund, to be jointly administered by the commissioners of the
13	department of agricultural resources and the department of transitional assistance, which shall be
14	known as the Massachusetts Healthy Incentives Fund. The Fund shall consist of all revenues
15	from public and private sources as appropriations, gifts, grants and donations and from the
16	federal government as reimbursements, grants-in-aid or other receipts to further the purposes of
17	the Fund in accordance with this section.
18	(c) The Department of Transitional Assistance and its partners shall apply for any
19	available federal programs such as Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive Grants administered by
20	the United States Department of Agriculture to provide matching benefits to be deposited in the
21	Fund.
22	SECTION 2. The Department of Transitional Assistance shall promulgate rules
23	and regulations to implement the program set forth in section 1.

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
