An Act exempting human services nonprofits from EMAC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 189A of Chapter 149, as established by Chapter 63 of the Acts of 2017, is hereby
 - amended at the end by inserting the following 2 paragraphs:

- 3 "The director of unemployment assistance shall develop a waiver to fully exempt
- 4 community-based human services organizations holding purchase-of-service contracts with the
- 5 Executive Office of Health and Human Services, Executive Office of Elder Affairs, Department
- 6 of Early Education and Care and the Department of Housing and Community Development from
- 7 paying the Employer Medical Assistance Contribution (EMAC) Supplement."
- 8 "The above hardship waiver that is developed shall allow community-based human
- 9 services organizations holding purchase-of-service contracts with the Executive Office of Health
- and Human Services, Executive Office of Elder Affairs, Department of Early Education and

- 11 Care and the Department of Housing and Community Development to be fully exempt from
- making any payments under the EMAC Supplement."
