By Messrs. Cabral of New Bedford and Vargas of Haverhill, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1762) of Antonio F. D. Cabral and others for legislation to establish a commission (including members of the General Court) to study the distribution of unrestricted local aid in the Commonwealth. Municipalities and Regional Government.

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In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to reform the distribution of unrestricted local aid.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. There shall be a commission to study the distribution of general local aid in
the commonwealth, including unrestricted general government aid, lottery aid as promulgated
394 in section 18C of chapter 58 of the General Laws and additional assistance aid to
municipalities. The study shall not include foundation aid as defined in section 2 of chapter 70 of
the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The commission shall examine the current formula used to distribute
unrestricted general government aid to municipalities, evaluate the effectiveness and equity of
said formula and make recommendations to establish a more equitable distribution of
unrestricted general government aid to municipalities in the commonwealth. The commission
shall review all aspects of general local aid including, but not limited to (a) the current allocation

12 of local aid to municipalities; (b) the reflectiveness of municipalities' needs in the proportional 13 distribution of the unrestricted general government aid formula; (c) any equity disparities that 14 exist between municipalities across the commonwealth related to local aid distribution; (d) the 15 ability to account for a municipality's change in population or tax base in a general local aid 16 funding formula; (e) the potential to calculate municipal costs based on a municipality's need for 17 municipal services and a municipality's ability to raise local revenue, less a municipality's local 18 revenues; and (f) any alternative formulas that may create a more equitable distribution of 19 general local aid.

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21 SECTION 3. The commission shall consist of: the secretary of administration and 22 finance, or a designee; the commissioner of the department of revenue, or a designee; 1 member 23 appointed by the state treasurer; 2 members of the senate, 1 of whom shall represent a gateway municipality as defined in section 3A of chapter 23A of the General Laws and shall serve as co-24 25 chair; 2 members of the house of representatives, 1 of whom shall represent a gateway 26 municipality as defined in said section 3A of said chapter 23A and shall serve as co-chair; 5 27 members appointed by the governor, 1 of whom shall be nominated by the Massachusetts 28 Municipal Association, Inc., 1 of whom shall be nominated by the Federal Reserve Bank of 29 Boston, 1 of whom shall be nominated by the Massachusetts Budget and Policy Center, Inc., 1 of 30 whom shall be nominated by the Massachusetts Taxpayers Foundation, Inc., and 1 of whom shall 31 be nominated by the Edward J. Collins, Jr. Center for Public Management at the University of 32 Massachusetts at Boston.

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34 SECTION 4. The commission shall file a report of its findings and recommendations, 35 including any new or revised local aid formulas, with the clerks of the senate and house of 36 representatives, the chairs of the senate and house committees on ways and means, and the 37 senate and house chairs of the joint committee on municipalities and regional government not 38 later than March 1, 2020.
