# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to prohibit the sale of "energy drinks" to persons under the age of 18.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Section 3 of chapter 270 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following new paragraph:

3 Whoever distributes, delivers, gives away or sells, any "Energy Drink" or other 4 ingredient, substance or beverage that exceeds a caffeine content of six (6) milligrams per one 5 (1) fluid ounce serving and contains taurine and glucuronolactone; or a soft drink that is 6 classified as a dietary supplement not regulated by the Food and Drug Administration and that 7 contains eighty (80) or more milligrams of caffeine per eight (8) fluid ounces and generally 8 includes a combination of methylxanthines, B vitamins, and herbal ingredients which are 9 advertised as being specifically designed to provide or increase energy to any persons under the 10 age of eighteen (18) shall be punished by a fine not less than fifty (50) dollars for the first

- 11 offense, one hundred (100) for the second offense and two hundred fifty (250) for the third
- 12 offense.
