An Act relative to the conservation land tax credit.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Subsection (p) of section 6 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing
2	in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding, in line 760, after the words "as
3	amended" the following words:-, or a nonprofit trust in realty organized for the purposes of land
4	conservation established pursuant to chapter 203.
5	SECTION 2. Said subsection (p) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so appearing, is
6	hereby amended by striking out, in line 826, the figure "\$2,000,000" and inserting in place
7	thereof the following figure:- \$3,000,000.
8	SECTION 3. Said subsection (p) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so appearing, is
9	hereby amended by striking out, in line 826, the figure "\$3,000,000" and inserting in place
10	thereof the following figure:- \$4,000,000.

11	SECTION 4. Said subsection (p) of said section 6 of said chapter 62, as so appearing, is
12	hereby amended by striking out, in line 826, the figure "\$4,000,000" and inserting in place
13	thereof the following figure:- \$5,000,000.
14	SECTION 5. Section 38AA of chapter 63, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding,
15	in line 29, after the words "as amended" the following words:-, or a nonprofit trust in realty
16	organized for the purposes of land conservation established pursuant to chapter 203.
17	SECTION 6. Said section 38AA of said chapter 63, as so appearing, is hereby amended
18	by striking out, in line 88, the figure "\$2,000,000" and inserting in place thereof the following
19	figure:- \$3,000,000.
20	SECTION 7. Said section 38AA of said chapter 63, as so appearing, is hereby amended
21	by striking out, in line 88, the figure "\$3,000,000" and inserting in place thereof the following
22	figure:- "\$4,000,000".
23	SECTION 8. Said section 38AA of said chapter 63, as so appearing, is hereby amended
24	by striking out, in line 88, the figure "\$4,000,000" and inserting in place thereof the following
25	figure:- "\$5,000,000".
26	SECTION 9. Sections 2 and 6 shall take effect on January 1, 2020.
27	SECTION 10. Sections 3 and 7 shall take effect on January 1, 2021.
28	SECTION 11. Sections 4 and 8 shall take effect on January 1, 2022.
29	SECTION 12. This act shall expire on December 31, 2029.
