The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act preserving essential services in our hospitals.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by striking subsection (4) of section 51G and inserting in place thereof the following
3 section:-

(4) Any hospital shall inform the department 90 days prior to the proposed closing of the

hospital or the proposed discontinuance of any essential health service provided therein. The

department shall by regulation define "essential health service" for the purposes of this section.

7 The department shall, in the event that a hospital proposes to discontinue an essential health

service or services, conduct a public hearing on the closure of said essential services or of the

9 hospital. The department shall determine whether any such discontinued services are necessary

for preserving access and health status in the hospital's service area and if the department so

determines, the essential health service shall not be proposed for closure for three years.
