In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act authorizing the City of Medford to utilize funds received from the surrounding community agreement entered into between the City of Medford and Wynn MA LLC for the purposes set forth in the agreement.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of the Massachusetts General Laws or the
2	provisions of any general law, special law or regulation to the contrary, the City of Medford,
3	through the Mayor of the City of Medford, may, subject to appropriation, utilize and expend all
4	funds received by way of the Surrounding Community Agreement executed on April 11, 2014
5	between the City of Medford and Wynn MA, LLC or its successors or assigns for the purposes
6	that are set forth in said agreement or as amended.
7	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and shall be effective during the
8	present fiscal year.
