In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to train culverts in the town of Lynnfield.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the 2 Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall grant a perpetual, non-transferable license to 3 the Town of Lynnfield, at no cost to the Town, for the purpose of cleaning, enlarging, expanding, 4 removing, replacing, removing debris and blockages from, and otherwise 5 maintaining and rendering useful, at the sole expense of the Town, the culverts located beneath 6 the railroad bed owned by the MBTA and located in that part of the Town known as "Reedy 7 Meadow," provided that the Town submit and environmental insurance policy, as described in 8 Section 31A of Chapter 23A of the M.G.L. The Town shall not be required to furnish any other 9 form of insurance, or any defense, indemnification or hold-harmless agreement with respect to 10 any claims, injuries, costs, damages or other relief arising out of or related to the pre-existing 11 release or threat of release of oil or hazardous materials, as defined in Chapter 21E of the M.G.L. 12 at or from said railroad bed.
