An Act relative to additional unemployment benefits for the neediest recipients currently excluded from the Lost Wages Assistance program.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of chapter 151A of the General Laws to  
2 the contrary, for the period of the week ending August 1st, 2020 through the week ending  
3 September 5, 2020, any claimant receiving unemployment benefits in an amount less than \$100  
4 per week, including the dependency allowance payable under section 29(c) of chapter 151A,  
5 shall be deemed eligible to receive a weekly benefit amount of \$100 per week during this period,  
6 which amount shall include the dependency allowance payable under said section 29(c).

7           A final report on the number of redeterminations under this section, and the additional  
8 lost wages assistance funds received for each week of the covered period shall be sent to the  
9 Joint Committee on Labor and Workforce Development and the House and Senate Committees  
10 on Ways and Means.
