The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act promoting affordability of home care services.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 4A of chapter 19A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2	Official Edition, in hereby amended striking out the text contained therein and inserting in place
3	thereof the following:

4 "Section 4A. The department shall establish a sliding fee scale to provide home care 5 services for certain persons whose income exceeds the limits established under Title XX of the 6 Social Security Act. On July first of each year, the department shall increase the financial 7 eligibility limits for home services, including the sliding fee scale, by a percentage equal to the 8 percentage increase in federal social security benefits for that fiscal year. The department shall 9 ensure that persons eligible for services based on established age and functional criteria shall 10 have access to care that is sufficiently affordable to prevent institutional long-term care 11 placements unless such placements are in the best medical interests of said eligible persons; 12 provided further, the department shall ensure that service recipients at or below the state median income shall pay no more than 60% of the cost of applicable care plans. The department shall 13

- 14 forward to the house and senate committees on ways and means on or before March first of each
- 15 year, a full report on the status of the home care program audit."
