The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to public assistance substance screening.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 1: The Department of Transitional Assistance shall establish a program for
- 2 random drug testing persons receiving public assistance, not inclusive to food stamps. This
- 3 program shall be applied only to individual(s) who hold prior convictions on any drug related
- 4 charge. This includes but is not limited to drug possession and intent to distribute.
- 5 Section 2: The Department of Transitional Assistance shall provide suitable remedies to
- 6 individuals with positive drug tests. The department shall also develop strategies to help ensure
- 7 that participants receiving transitional assistance are drug-free. Individuals who do not comply
- 8 with the rehabilitation recommendations set forth by the department of transitional assistance
- 9 may face a suspension of their benefits.

- Section 3: The Department of Transitional Assistance shall collect, record, and publish
- 11 statistics relating to those individuals who collect public assistance and test positive for
- 12 substances for which they do not have a prescription.
