### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to youth voter engagement.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 51 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence:-
- 3 Every pre-registrant registered under section 47A, who is 17 years of age may vote pursuant to
- 4 section 47A.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 47A of said chapter 51, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
- 6 striking out the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—Subsequent
- 7 to such pre-registration, a pre-registrant who is 17 years of age, when pre-registered as provided
- 8 in this section, shall be eligible to vote at any preliminary or primary election to be held if they
- 9 shall be the age of 18 years at the time of the subsequent special or general election and no other
- pre-registrant shall be allowed to vote until the pre-registrant obtains full age unless otherwise
- 11 permitted by law.
