**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**

An Act excluding the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award from taxable income.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 3 of Chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended in paragraph (a) of Subsection B by adding the following  
3 subparagraph:-

4 (20) Any amount received as part of the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award, as  
5 stipulated in subtitle D of title I of the National and Community Service Act of 1990. The Segal  
6 AmeriCorps Education Award is available to individuals who complete a term of service in the  
7 AmeriCorps program. The education award can be used to pay education costs at eligible  
8 institutions of higher learning including technical schools, for educational training, or to repay  
9 qualified student loans, as determined eligible by the federal government.

10 SECTION 2. This law shall become effective 180 days after its passage.
