## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act authorizing the city of Worcester to convey a certain parcel of land.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary but subject to
- 2 paragraphs (a), (b) and (g) of section 16 of chapter 30B of the General Laws, the city of
- Worcester may, subject to terms and conditions as determined by the city manager, convey to
- 4 Saint John's High School located in the town of Shrewsbury a certain parcel of land containing
- 5 83,347 square feet, more or less, located on Main street in the town of Shrewsbury and shown on
- 6 the plan entitled "Plan Of Land In Shrewsbury, MA, Land Owned By The City of Worcester,
- ANR Plan", dated August 20, 2017, prepared by the city of Worcester department of public
- 8 works and parks, engineering division, recorded with the Worcester district registry of deeds in
- 9 book 936, page 72. The parcel shall be used for school purposes.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
