Rausch, Sean Garballey and other members of the General Court for legislation to create a special commission to improve transparency and affordability at the Group Insurance Commission. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to create a special commission to improve transparency and affordability at the Group Insurance Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. There shall be a special commission governed by section 2A of chapter 4 of 2 the General Laws to: (i) assess public transparency at the Group Insurance Commission with 3 respect to its procurement and contracting processes; (ii) make recommendations to improve 4 transparency at the Group Insurance Commission including, but not limited to, requiring the 5 public disclosure of its vendor contracts involving health care costs and pharmaceutical pricing; 6 (iii) evaluate the potential use of reference based pricing as a means of making medical costs 7 through the Group Insurance Commission affordable and uniform; (iv) investigate the value and 8 viability of a public option health insurance plan available to public and non-public employees in 9 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The commission shall file its findings and 10 recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry those recommendations 11 into effect, with the clerks of the senate and the house of representatives, the chairs of the senate

and house committees on public service and the chairs of the senate and house committees onhealth care financing not later than December 1, 2019.

14 The commission shall consist of 1 member who shall be appointed by the senate 15 president, who shall serve as co-chair; 1 member who shall be appointed by the minority leader 16 of the senate; 1 member who shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, 17 who shall serve as co-chair; 1 member who shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 18 house of representatives; the secretary of administration and finance or a designee; and 1 19 member to be appointed by each of the following organizations: the Massachusetts Teachers 20 Association; the American Federation of Teachers, Massachusetts; the Retired State, County and 21 Municipal Employees Association of Massachusetts; the Massachusetts Public Employees 22 Council, #93, AFSCME, Massachusetts State Labor Council, AFL CIO; Massachusetts State 23 Employees Association, NAGE; the Massachusetts Municipal Association; the Massachusetts 24 Chapter of the AFL CIO; and the Massachusetts Organization of State Engineers and Scientists.
