The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to guarantee debt-free public higher education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "opportunities." in line 14 the
3	following words:-
4	It is hereby further declared to be the policy of the commonwealth to guarantee free
5	public higher education as a right for all residents.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 15A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
7	following section:-
8	Section 45. (a) Definitions
9	As used in this section, the following words shall have the following meanings, unless the
10	context clearly requires otherwise:
11	"Board", the Board of Higher Education.

12 "Eligible Student", a resident of the commonwealth as determined by the board of higher 13 education's residency status for tuition classification purposes, who has attained a high school 14 diploma or its equivalent in the commonwealth, who is admitted to and enrolled in a 15 Massachusetts public college or university or other public certificate, vocational, or adult 16 education program, and who is enrolled full-time or part-time, and who maintains a cumulative 17 GPA of 2.0 or above.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the
board shall create a grant program to pay the equivalent of tuition and mandatory fees to an
eligible student at any Massachusetts public college or university, or certificate, vocational, or
training program at a public institution, up to the equivalent of four years of public college or
university.

(c) The grant shall supplement and shall not replace state grants, gift aid, institutional aid,
or federal aid through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid process. The board shall
promulgate regulations to ensure funds from this program do not affect eligibility for other state
grants, gift aid, institutional aid, or federal aid through the Free Application for Federal Student
Aid process.

(d) All public higher education and public vocational training institutions shall be
considered eligible institutions for this program and there shall be no restrictions on a student's
choice of academic programs.

31 (e) The board shall provide an annual notice of eligibility for this program to all eligible
32 students and all new graduates from a Massachusetts high school or GED program. The board
33 will maintain a database of all students currently or potentially eligible for this program.

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
