### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to obsolete court records.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 27A of Chapter 221 of the General Laws, as amended by Section
- 2 124 of Chapter 46 of the Acts of 2015, is hereby further amended in paragraph (1) by adding at
- 3 the end there of the following:- "The Supreme Judicial Court may by rule or order make
- 4 exceptions to this ten year retention requirement for papers filed in or relating to matters
- 5 involving alleged violations of laws, rules or regulations regarding motor vehicle civil
- 6 infractions, motor vehicle parking, littering, bicycles, pedestrians, municipal dog control, or non-
- 7 criminal dispositions of municipal ordinance or by-law violations, or other non-criminal
- 8 regulatory offenses."
